Dr. Julia Davids has been the Music Director of the North Shore Choral Society since 2009. She enjoys a thriving career as a versatile musician. She is the Stephen J. Hendrickson Chair of Choral Activities at North Park University Chicago where she directs the choirs and teaches conducting and music education. As a soprano soloist, she specializes in early music. This season includes solo appearances with Bella Voce and the International Beethoven Festival. Julia also serves as Director of Music Ministries at Trinity



United Methodist Church, Wilmette. Julia has been the Artistic Director of the Canadian Chamber Choir, Canada's national professional-level chamber choir since 2004, and produced their debut recording "In Good Company."

Dr. Davids is in demand as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor. She is co-author, with Stephen LaTour, of *Vocal Technique - A Guide for Conductors, Teachers, and Singers.* She holds degrees in Education, Conducting, and Voice Performance from the University of Western Ontario (London, Ontario), the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor, Michigan) and a D.M. from Northwestern University. Julia resides in Skokie with her husband, baroque violinist Martin Davids, and their two children, Judith and Solomon.



Pianist and organist extraordinaire, recitalist and coach, Sharon Peterson, begins her 29th year with NSCS. Sharon has been with the Chicago Symphony Chorus since 1978, and has worked with Chicago Symphony Singers, CSC's resident ensembles, North Park, Northwestern, and Roosevelt universities. Sharon is the organist at North Park Theological Seminary and just completed 16 years as organist for North Park Church. During

the summer of 2013, she worked at the New England Music Camp as accompanist for Frederick L. Hemke, Saxophone Institute.

The North Shore Choral Society explores, studies, and performs a wide range of choral music for the enrichment and enjoyment of its singers and audiences.


The North Shore Choral Society's new season takes us to Heaven, brings us back to Earth, and returns us to Heaven!

The North Shore Choral Society and the Evanston Children's Choir bring us back to earth with a rare opportunity to hear Paul Winter's Missa Gaia/ Earth Mass. The piece is an environmental liturgy of contemporary music featuring choirs, a soloist, and an instrumental ensemble of soprano saxophone, English horn, cello, piano, organ, percussion, and the recorded calls of wolves, whales, and loons to celebrate the whole earth as a sacred place. Since 1985 the Earth Mass has been performed annually at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City to celebrate the Feast of St. Francis and the blessing of animals. Emerging Chicago gospel singer, Felicia Patton, joins the choirs in this unique work, which is seldom performed in our area.
